Students of lower socioeconomic status (compulsory category)	The average monthly income per household member does not exceed EUR 375,22, that is, 85% budget base which is established each year by the relevant regulation. With the total income, the calculation of income includes tax-free receipts listed in the Ordinance on state scholarship awards.	- Confirmation of the competent tax administration office for all members of the household for the last available calendar year at the time of submission of the application. For members of a shared household who are retired or are entitled to a survivor's pension, it is necessary to submit the relevant documentation on the amount of pension received for the last calendar year available at the time of submission of the application, in addition to the certificate from the competent tax administration office, and the certificate from the competent pension insurance institution - completed statement about the members of a shared household (a shared household Is a family or other community of people living together at the same address and sharing living expenses regardless of kinship) – a separate document.
Refugees and asylum seekers (compulsory category)		A decision granting asylum or subsidiary protection; - residence permit. Also, it is important for these persons to prove their identity, which is possible by: - a passport for an asylum seeker; - a special passport for a foreign citizen; - another identification document.
Students with support for inclusion	In the previous program period students with special needs, therefore students whose personal, physical, mental or health condition is such that their participation in the project / mobility activity would not be possible without additional financial or other types of support	Certificate from a family doctor or a specialist doctor (must be original, not older than 6 months) and decision of the competent institution/state body which includes percentage and type of damage (if applicable, a copy).
